Thank you for your interest in the 2017 Spirit of Adventure University of Scouting. We are pleased to be offering over 110 choices of courses this year. The course list on the following pages is sorted by class start time and program area. Please note the course duration, as some classes run for more than one hour in length. Some courses are assigned to a particular program area, (Cub Scout or Boy Scout), where we feel the subject matter is most applicable. General Study courses have subject matter that is applicable across all programs; however, you are welcome to take any course in any area. Course numbers consist of a 3 letter prefix indicating the program area and a 3 digit code. For General Studies (GEN), Cub Scout (CUB) and Boy Scout (BOY) courses, the first digit of the number indicates the difficulty or experience level of the subject matter. 1 indicates basic level or no prior experience, while level 2 or 3 courses may require experience or prior knowledge of the subject matter or the scouting program.

Some classes may have a limit on the number of students enrolled. If a course has reached its full enrollment, it will not appear on the registration web site.

There are also two programs for Youth Leaders (Boy Scouts and Venturers). (Course codes YLT)

Are you a new Cub Scout leader? Can't decide what to take? Check out the last pages for course suggestions.

We will have a Midway with both Scouting and outside exhibitors available in the gymnasium from 11:00 AM to 2:00 PM to help you discover new opportunities for all of the Scouting programs. Plan to stop by and visit during your lunch period.

This year courses will run for 7 instruction periods, with the Midway and the cafeteria service open during periods 3, 4, and 5 at 11 AM, noon and 1PM. Make sure you register for a specific lunch/midway period during these times.

Walk-in registrations will be accepted on the day of the event, however, if there is large number of walk-ins causing registration delays walk-in registrants may miss the first period class. The registration staff will be available to help you with any questions or concerns.

Leader Specific Training Courses

These courses are offered at University for those leaders who cannot take the online courses or who cannot attend one of the other in-person trainings. If you have previously completed these courses you do not need retake them.
