

AWARD DESCRIPTIONS

Rookie of the Year Award:

This award is presented to an adult leader with two years of service or less, who has demonstrated exceptional dedication to the Scouting program on a unit or District level.

Outstanding Scouter (Cub Scouts):

This award is presented to an adult leader who has demonstrated superior leadership, knowledge and dedication for the betterment of the Cub Scouting program on a unit or District level. This could include Tiger, Den or Webelos leader as well as Cubmaster or Committee Member.

Outstanding Scouter (Scouts BSA):

This award is presented to an adult leader who has demonstrated superior leadership, knowledge and dedication for the betterment of the Scouts BSA program on a unit or District level. This could include Assistant SM, Scoutmaster, or Committee Member.

Outstanding District Committee Member:

This award is presented to an adult leader who has demonstrated superior leadership, knowledge and dedication for the betterment of Scouting program at the District level.

Outstanding Scouter (Venturing):

This award is presented to an adult leader who has demonstrated superior leadership, knowledge and dedication for the betterment of the Venture Scouting program on a unit or District level.

District Award of Merit:

This is the highest award that can be given to a Scouter of a district who has rendered exceptional service on a Unit or District level. This award has its own nomination form – available on the council web site.

Silver Beaver Award:

The Silver Beaver Award is presented upon action of the <u>Spirit of Adventure Council</u> <u>Executive Board</u> for outstanding service to youth within the Council or for outstanding longtime service to youth by a registered Scouter residing within that Council. The average tenure for Silver Beaver candidates is ten years or longer. Career members of the Boy Scouts of America may receive this award upon concurrence of the Council Scout Executive and the Director of Operations at the National office, BSA. This award has its own nomination form

- 6. Cooperates with the district and council.
- 7. Works closely with their chartered organization and its associated units to provide a quality-scouting program.

Note: The nature and value of "noteworthy service to youth" may consist of a single plan or decisions that contributed vitally to the lives of large numbers of youth or it may have been given to a small group over an Extended period of time.

- 3. Completed at least 4 years as a registered Scouter.
- 4. Consideration must be given to the nominee's Scouting position and the corresponding opportunity to render outstanding service beyond the expectations of that Scouting position.
- 5. Cooperates with the district and council.
- 6. Works closely with their chartered organization and its associated units to provide a quality-scoutingprogram.

PROCEDURE

- 1 Annually, the district advancement chair will appoint a temporary special award committee of not more than three persons who will consider all candidates and make recommendations of those to receive the award to the District Executive.
- 2. The District Executive will inform the district chairman of those nominations approved by the award committee.
- 3. The following procedure is suggested for such presentation ceremonies:
 - a. The recipient and spouse should be in attendance at the annual meeting or recognition dinner.
 - b. A district or council representative should explain the award and its significance.
 - c. Eagle Scouts, Silver Award Venturers or prior Donald MacLellan honorees should be asked to escort the recipient to a place of honor at the head table or on stage.
 - d. A suitable citation for each recipient should be read indicating what each has done in Scouting.

 - f. A group picture may be taken for use in community newspapers (unit responsibility).

BACKGROUND OF DONALD H. MACLELLEN

Donald's journey began with Walter Amann, a friend of Don, who was interested in the outdoors. At the time Walter was the Scoutmaster of Troop 1 West Roxbury. In 1939, with an increase and interest in Scouting, there was a need to form another troop in the community. Donald and Walter, together, formed Troop 4 West Roxbury. Donald became the Assistant Scoutmaster of that Troop with eight boys. In 1940 Walter was drafted into the Army and Donald then became the acting Scoutmaster. Donald was drafted into the Army 1941 and was active until 1947.

In 1958, Donald and his family moved to the town of Westwood. Chuck, his son, joined Troop 1 Islington. The Scoutmaster at the time was Albert R. Dean and Donald joined the Troop Committee. After Dean's son achieved the rank of Eagle, he stayed on as Scoutmaster for another year.

He became Scoutmaster in 1963. While Scoutmaster, he was a Roundtable Commissioner for four years and on the District Committee Training Chairman for five years. Additionally, he was a Scoutmaster of three Jamboree Troops in: 1981, 1985 and 1989. Around that time Donald had the pleasure of meeting Lady Baden Powell at a special dinner she attended hosted by the Old Colony Council.

He was active in the Order of the Arrow. He was invited by the local council to participate in the ordeal separate from Troop 1 Islington. A year after his ordeal he went with Troop 1 and received his brotherhood along with his scouts. Shortly after that he was invited back to become a member of the Vigil Class.

In 1988, he stepped down as Scoutmaster of Troop 1 Islington and has served as a Unit Commissioner for Westwood until 2008.

His most memorable experiences was Wood Badge. His first experience began in New Jersey, class 302. At that time it was national headquarters for the Boy Scouts of America.

"Wood badge teaches the basics Scouting. It's about everything a boy meets when he is in a troop. It guides them along...their new career". You have to have a love of the outdoors. It's like Boy Scouting on an adult level. "

He received his three beads and did that four times before receiving his four beads as a director. "Being a director of a course was like running a corporation", he said. After directing a course he participated as a councilor three more times.

His most missed memories is "working with the boys". Donald felt that the hardest part of being Scoutmaster is trying to get parents involved. He wanted the boys to be in the program to advance them and to make sure they understand that as they get older they become a role model for the younger boys.

He believes the Boy Scouts of America has a positive future:

"The Boy Scouts of America is a challenging youth program. The program one provides should be under constant review and leaders cannot lose sight of the fact that scouting is for boys. As soon as we start telling them what to do we lose the program. The program needs be boy oriented and not related to what the adults want to do. All we have to do is listen to the boys."

The veteran award is an adult recognition. However, tenure earned as a youth may be included in the total number of years registered.

After five years of registered service in the Boy Scouts of America, an adult may, upon application, receive the designation of "Veteran," provided the person agrees to live up to the Scouting obligations; to keep local Scouting authorities in the community in which residing informed as to availability for service; and further, to be as active in the promotion of the cause of Scouting as circumstances and conditions permit. Service in Scouting organizations other than the Boy Scouts of America does not count toward veteran recognition. An individual must currently be a paid registered member of the Boy Scouts of America in order to receive an award.

An adult designated veteran shall pay the regular registration fee if desiring to continue to retain active connection with the movement.

Scouters desiring recognition as 5-, 10-, 15-, 20-, 25-, 30-, 35-, 40-, 45-, 50-, 55-, 60-, 65-, 70-, 75-, or 80-year veterans must have maintained an active registered relationship for the required number of years, paying the annual registration fee.

The records of the national office and local council shall determine eligibility. The periods of service claimed for veteran recognition need not be continuous.

Unit Leader Award of Merit

Background

Quality unit leadership is the key to a quality unit program-and it leads to better Scout retention. Statistics show that if young people stay engaged in the program for at least five years, the BSA's influence likely will stay with them for the rest of their lives. A quality Scouting experience will help keep Scouts in the program, and the Boy Scouts of America created the Unit Leader Award of Merit to recognize the quality unit leaders who make that happen.

The Unit Leader Award of Merit replaces the Scoutmaster, Varsity Team Coach, and Venturing Crew Advisor award of merit programs. This new recognition has revised requirements, and Cubmasters and Skippers are also eligible for this recognition.

Requirements

The nominee must

- 1. Be a currently registered Cubmaster, Scoutmaster, Coach, Advisor, or Skipper who has served in that position at least 18 continuous months.
- 2. Meet the training requirements for the registered position.
- 3. Distribute a printed or electronic annual unit program plan and calendar to each family in the unit.
- 4. Have a leader succession plan in place.
- 5. Effectively use the advancement method so that at least 60 percent of the unit's youth have advanced at least once during the last 12 months.
- 6. Cultivate a positive relationship with the chartered organization.
- 7. Project a positive image of Scouting in the community.

Nomination Procedure

- 1. The unit committee chair completes the Unit Leader Award of Merit Nomination Form on behalf of the unit committee. For Boy Scout troops, Varsity Scout teams, Venturing crews, and Sea Scout ships, the nomination must include endorsement by the senior patrol leader, team captain, crew president, or ship's boatswain, respectively.
- 2. The unit or district commissioner certifies that the form is complete.
- 3. The unit submits the nomination form to the council for approval by the Scout executive and council commissioner or
- president. The council is responsible for processing the award.

The Award

Upon receipt of the approved nomination form, the council may present the Unit Leader Award of Merit, which includes a certificate, square knot with the appropriate device, and a special unit leader emblem. Recognition of this achievement may be presented at appropriate district or council events, such as district or council leader recognition dinners, training events, and board meetings.

The award may be presented to youth for each program, Cub Scouts, Boy Scouts, Varsity Scouts, Venturers, and Sea Scouts, if the individual meets the requirements in each program. Only one knot is worn with the devices of each program that the award was earned in.

GENERAL INFORMATION

The District Award of Merit is a council award presented by districts in the same manner that the Silver Beaver is a national award presented by councils.

The award is available to Scouters who render service of an outstanding nature at the district level.

The award is made available annually on the basis of 1 for each 25 traditional units or fraction thereof. The district need not present all the awards to which it is entitled each year.

It is not appropriate to nominate a Scouter who has already received this award.

A professional Scouter or other council employee may not receive this award based on employment service. However, a professional Scouter or employee who also serves as a volunteer Scouter may be eligible, based on *volunteerservice*.

REQUIREMENTS

- 1. A nominee must be a registered Scouter.
- 2. A nominee must have rendered noteworthy service to youth in Scouting, outside Scouting, or both.
 - Note: The nature and value of "noteworthy service to youth" may consist of a single plan or decisions that contributed vitally to the lives of large numbers of youth or it may have been given to a small group over an extended period of time.
- 3. Consideration must be given to the nominee's Scouting position and the corresponding opportunity to render outstanding service beyond the expectations of that Scouting position.
- 4. The nominee's attitude toward and cooperation with the district and/or council is to be taken into consideration.
- 5. Nominations cannot be considered for posthumous awards.

PROCEDURE

- 1. Annually, district chairmen will appoint a temporary special District Award of Merit committee of not more than five persons who will consider all candidates and make recommendations of those to receive the award to the council through the Scout executive.
- 2. The Scout executive will inform the district chairman of those nominations approved by the council committee.
- 3. The following procedure is suggested for such presentation ceremonies:
 - a. The recipient and spouse should be in attendance at the annual meeting or recognition dinner.
 - b. A district and/or council officer should explain the award and its significance.
 - c. Eagle Scouts or Silver Award Venturers should be asked to escort the recipients to a place of honor at the head table or on stage.
 - d. A suitable citation for each recipient should be read indicating what each has done in Scouting.
 - e. The award (certificate, No. 33719; plaque, No. 17565; and lapel pin, No. 17551) may be presented at this time with appropriate congratulations.
 - f. The only uniform insignia which accompanies this award is an embroidered overhand knot, No. 05013.
 - g. A group picture may be taken for use in neighborhood or community newspapers (district responsibility)

- Long-established policy limits the award of the Silver Beaver to adults 21 and older who are registered with the Boy Scouts of America as volunteer Scouters. Explorer leaders are eligible to be awarded the William H. Spurgeon III Award.
- 4. Nominations will not be considered for current or former professional Scouters within five (5) years of their leaving employment with the BSA. Other council employees (part time or full time) are eligible to receive the Silver Beaver Award based on their volunteer service, not employed service.
- 5. Nominations cannot be considered for posthumous awards.
- 6. Order Silver Beaver insignia using the regular Supply order form from the Supply Group distribution center.

Article X, Section 6, Clause 3 Silver Beaver Award

The Boy Scouts of America, acting through the National Court of Honor, may award the Silver Beaver for distinguished service to youth upon the following basis and procedure:

- a) Each local council may process their own annual allotment of Silver Beaver awards and shall send a list of Silver Beaver recipients presented each calendar year to the National Court of Honor no later than January 31 of the following year.
- b) The award is made for noteworthy service of exceptional character to youth by registered Scouters, Cub Scouters, Varsity Scouters, and Venturing leaders within the territory under the jurisdiction of a local council.
- c) As evidence of the award there shall be presented: a suitable certificate, duly authenticated by the Boy Scouts of America, pursuant to the action of the National Court of Honor; and a miniature Silver Beaver suspended by a blue, white, and blue ribbon to be worn around the neck.
- d) It shall be a general policy that no public announcements shall be made by the local council in advance of action by the National Court of Honor with reference to names presented for consideration.
- e) These awards shall be made to the recipients by the local council concerned in connection with its annual meeting or other public location.
- f Each duly chartered local council shall be
-) entitled to one nomination. Councils having more than 60 units shall be entitled to further nominations on the basis of one for each additional 60 units or fraction thereof in their territory, as of December 31 preceding the nomination, according to the records of the national office.
- g) Councils not using their full allotment in any year may accumulate the unused portion for use in any subsequent year.
- h) In extraordinary cases, the Silver Beaver Award may be made by the National Court of Honor to a Scouter upon the recommendation of the duly constituted Scouting authorities having supervision of one or more units of the Boy Scouts of America, located outside of the United States and not under the jurisdiction of a local council.
